Neighbors near the tennis and pickleball courts are looking for help before the city embarks on further expanding the court complex.






The Issues

→ Loud and lights, late!

Noisy for nearby neighbors, who have to deal with late night disruptions

→ Crowd capacity concerns

With growing popularity, too many people at and around the courts, especially during weekends

We've been patient as residents, who are respecting players' right to enjoy our public spaces, but players are *not* reciprocating that respect. We cannot continue with our patience forever, and the City needs to take action on...

- → the noise, especially late
- → the crowds
- → the parking and traffic concerns

The changes we're requesting

- Adjust the hours to close at 9 pm
- Determine and enforce capacity
- Explicitly ban any amplified noise
- Add 4-way STOP at Redwood & Center
